1. Background

Northwest Pacific Region Environmental Cooperation Center (NPEC), host organization of CEARAC, established "Northwest Pacific Regional Node of the Global Partnership on Marine litter" with NOWPAP RCU using budgetary support from the Global Programme of Action for the Protection of the Marine Environment from Land-based Activities (GPA) in 2014. The objectives of this regional node are (1) to enhance awareness of marine litter prevention actions at the national, local and grass-root levels, (2) to strengthen information exchange on best practices and measures for prevention of marine litter input among the NOWPAP member states and beyond, through Global Partnership on Marine Litter (GPML), (3) to enhance knowledge of GPML among local governments, NGOs/NPOs and local people in the NOWPAP countries. However, the contents of the regional node are limited. Therefore, CEARAC applied for another financial support of GPA in order to add new contents on micro plastics and prevention of marine litter input conducted by various stakeholders. Adding new information on the situation in Japan will be finished by March 2016.
